Narrated by Golden Globe winner and Oscar nominee, Ali MacGraw, "Invisible Corps: In Officio Salutis" explains the history of the U.S. Public Health Service, how important public health is to our nation and how the Commissioned Corps of the U.S. Public Health Service has been the key to saving millions of American lives. Although invisible, they touch the lives of Americans every day: from fluoridated drinking water to eliminating malaria in our country. The USPHS Commissioned Corps cared for veterans before there was a Department of Veterans Affairs and worked on water and air pollution before there was an Earth Day.

The project revolves around a one-hour documentary that will be shown (ADD LOCATION, DATE AND TIME). The program is being made available to all PBS stations nationally along with short elements for use by educators, health care professionals and on social media.

"I started this program in 2020, after a conversation with Assistant Surgeon General, retired Rear Admiral Pamela Schweitzer," explains producer/director Chris Schueler. "We had been working together on a film about vaccine misinformation and she asked if I had heard of the USPHS Commissioned Corps. I had no idea of the history, the amazing work and the structure of the Corps that keeps our nation so safe – particularly from infectious disease but also the long-term benefits of their public health efforts." After over two years of research and interviews, the program began to take shape. It covers, not only the 200 plus year history of the U.S. Public Health Service, but up to and through the COVID-19 pandemic and their efforts, rarely seen or acknowledged, to save American lives now and in the future

While the uniformed services of the United States include the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, Space Force and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, the Commissioned Corps of the U.S. Public Health Service is **the only uniformed service in the world dedicated to public health**. In addition to day-to-day responsibilities to support their agencies', Public Health Service officers are prepared to deploy before, during, and after any public health crisis. Their mission is to "protect, promote, and advance the health and safety of the nation."

The pandemic has accentuated divides in our country, especially regarding belief in science and healthcare professionals. It is crucial to un-politicize public health and to understand how it works and what will ultimately create a healthy country. Over the past several decades, the U.S. PHS Commissioned Corps has been altered in ways that defeat its purpose and affect our nations' health. The pandemic is a frightening example of the critical need for the USPHS CC.

The USPHS Commissioned Corps has 11 professional categories; physicians, nurses, dentists, veterinarians, scientists, engineers, environmental health officers, dietitians, therapists, pharmacists and health services officers in 800 locations across the US and around the world. They deploy to multiple public health missions including direct support to the Department of Defense. Public Health Service officers work in over 20 federal agencies from the Indian Health Service to the U.S. Coast Guard, National Park Service and Federal Bureau of Prisons. They are the link through our federal governmental health agencies.

This one-hour PBS documentary covers the history and role of the Public Health Service Commissioned Corps. Interviews for the program include **four former Surgeons General**, **the current Surgeon General** along with excerpts from past Presidents as well as "boots on the ground" Public Health Service officers and administrators. Viewers will learn how officers throughout history have researched, developed and launched campaigns and cures on a wide variety of public health issues in order to save American lives up to and through the current pandemic.

This project will help Americans understand the USPHS Commissioned Corps' role in health care, research, regulation and disaster relief. The documentary explains how this Corps works with our federal, state and local governmental agencies, with American Indians and Alaskan Natives and even the national park and federal prison system. Our USPHS Commissioned Corps is positioned to be the connection and leader for the nations' health for decades to come.
